








A Message from DSF's Interim Executive Director



Dear DSF Friends,

As I write my last introduction to the Disciples Seminary Foundation's annual Graduate Newsletter, my spirit is filled with gratitude for the time I have spent serving DSF, first as Dean (2015-2018) and then as Interim Executive Director (2020-present). I have caught the passion that deeply resides in the fabric of DSF – supporting the formation of emerging theological leaders. This passion has been fueled by the witness of the journey students take to fulfill their urges for theological knowledge and preparation for ministry – lay and ordained.

DSF began supporting emerging theological leaders in 1959. Since that time, students have completed one academic year after another, like clockwork. The seasons of study from fall through spring held students while they were burning the midnight oil to rehearse a class presentation, finish a research paper, and/or study for a final exam. Among such diligent students, there have been those who complete program requirements to earn a seminary degree or a program certificate. DSF is proud to showcase these students and our internal workings of living out our mission – to support the formation of emerging theological leaders. This mission, consistent since 1959, has also led us to reflect on our vision for the future, our identity as a theological organization in covenant with the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) and the United Church of Christ, and our core institutional values.

DSF Board of Trustees Names a New Executive Director



On June 20, the Board of Directors of Disciples Seminary Foundation (DSF) announced Rev. Dr. Christy Newton as the newly appointed Executive Director of DSF. Rev. Dr. Newton will begin her ministry on August 1, replacing Rev. Belva Brown Jordan who has served as Interim Executive Director since January 2020.

Since 2013, Rev. Dr. Newton has served as the Senior Pastor at First Christian Church of Vallejo where her achievements include the mentorship of five student ministers as well as her work as a committed member of a Clergy Women's Circle of Trust for over 16 years.

"On behalf of the Board of Directors, please join me in welcoming the Rev. Dr. Christy Newton as the new Executive Director of DSF!" said

Dr. Thomas Perring, DSF Board Chair. "She brings a perfect balance to this position by her depth of experiences as an educator, mentor, and local pastor. 
























ocido del evangelio y puedan ver que la vida es mejor con Dios.


What does the future of your ministry look like? As a worship leader, I want our ministry to grow in all aspects, from getting new singers and musicians.


REV. MARCO A. SANTIAGO GONZAGA

REV. GYUSEON MIN Claremont School of Theology MTS

I have worked with people with developmental disabilities and their families, and I wanted to better understand their inner world and naturally became interested in their spiritual formation. This is what drew me to seminary. My seminary education has given me a deeper understanding of what I need to do and helped me realize what I have in my heart for my congregation. I also learned two things that will contribute to the spiritual formation of the people I serve and further my ministry.

One is that by experimenting and trying out different possible worship forms for people with developmental disabilities, I had the opportunity to study and implement in depth the use of the body to participate in worship for people who have limited use of language. I think this worship model is very appropriate for people with developmental disabilities and is a good attempt to allow them to express themselves to God. For people with disabilities, they are often controlled in worship due to their disability and are put in a very passive position. But my congregation, Wow Worship, interacts with them and reveals to them that they are persons who exist in God. This expression of self will help them see themselves as living spiritual beings in relationship with God.

The other is the ability to provide pastoral counseling to the immigrant Korean community. The creation of Wow Counseling Center as a means of financial sustainability for Wow Church has allowed me to transform my personal counseling ministry into an organizational structure that can train pastoral counselors and help many people suffering from mental health challenges in the immigrant community. Understanding and discerning psychological suffering is crucial to everyone's spiritual formation. I was interested in a small ministry called Spiritual Formation of People with Developmental Disabilities. However, it was another experience to witness how God is leading the ministry. All we have to do is be present and be there in the field. The invisible work is done by the invisible God. After graduation, WOW ministry will continue to develop worship services for people with developmental disabilities and mental health care for people in the world.

I was inspired to attend seminary by a ministerial intern at my church, Rev. Dr. Nancy Fowler, then a student at CST. I wanted to learn more, but seminary didn't enter into it. Then Nancy, in a sermon, mentioned "needing to do more" and it clicked for me! I

She helped me open up context and meanings in Hebrew Bible texts, and I've had the joy of sharing some of this with my students. This has also led to an interest in Ancient Near Eastern literature.

I'll take time off after graduation. However, I'm also looking into a research project on Christian evan-

while I was serving with Global Ministries in Nicaragua. There, I fell in love with teaching theology. I also noticed that my Pentecostal students, both in our partner church and in the seminary, had unique perspectives on biblical interpretation - and I wanted to learn more. Getting to study in-depth the interpretive practices of Pentecostal students in church and seminary has broadened my understanding of the ways that Christians interpret the Bible and sharpened my analytical "tools" for understanding how interpretation interacts with culture, power, and justice. My dissertation, an ethnographic study of biblical interpretation among Nicaraguan Pentecostals, considers both church and academic interpretation

as cultural practices, forms of litembedded eracy in social, historical, political, and theological contexts. As students between move these interpretive communities, they navigate differing practices textual connected to di-

vergent understandings of what the Bible is and how to use it.

I was ordained in 2005 at University Christian Church in Hyattsville, MD. I dream of churches that are

deeply engaged in their local communities and connected to the global church, always with eyes, ears, and hearts open to love God and neighbor (whether near or far). On July 1, 2022, I began as Assistant Professor of New Testament and Louisville Institute Postdoctoral Fellow at Berkeley School of Theology.

Therefore, postcolonial theology has to be explained from an individual/ community perspective.

My plan is to inspire and lift my community. In doing so, I have been accepted to teach at Kanana Theological Seminary in America Samoa in Fall 2023, with the hopes of mentoring students within spiritual growth. I am also in Training and Care in the CCNC-N region and hope to be ordained sometime this year.

instructor. My education has given me new lenses, tools, and a network to better understand labor, migration, and ethnicity that greatly inform my praxis. In my dissertation, I employ Latinx studies framed by postcolonial anthropological and sociological understandings of theories of labor, migration, and ethnicity, like mestizaje and hybridity, to derive a nuanced understanding of representations of Judean ethnicity during the Persian period as found in the biblical books of Ezra-Nehemiah and Ruth.

I currently serve as the bilingual As-

sociate Pastor and Director of Community Resiliency Programs at Eden United Church of Christ in Hayward, CA. I aspire to continue bridging direct service with systems change work via partnerships with public

agencies and community changemakers. I plan to continue solidarity work with our Newcomer Navigation Center serving asylum-seekers and continue to serve as a seminary field education site mentor. I hope to also have more time for adjunct teaching and building out more contextual/ experiential learning opportunities and partnerships. What excites me most about ministry is the transformative opportunity to transition from a ministry based in hospitality to one based in belonging, which decenters the host and challenges the "us/them" mentality in regards to the boundaries of both church and community building, converting charity to solidarity.

In the spring of 2019, I felt a spontaneous nudge from the Holy Spirit to pursue theological education. I had

been serving for three years prior as an apartment community missionary (alongside my partner Aizaiah) in Anaheim, CA, committed to building a sense of unity, care, and hospi-

tality through the love of Christ. Living and serving in this diverse apartment community greatly expanded my perspective on the powerful and radical love of God, and I felt the Spirit leading me to pursue seminary so that I could deepen my theological understanding and better support my community and the world towards healing, wholeness, and justice. During seminary, I gave birth to my third and

fourth children, and my experience as a mother was a primary influence on the way I integrated my theological learning with my daily life. Because I experienced sheltering in place during the COVID-19 pandemic with my children, I was invited to deeply reflect on the intersection of theology, parenting, social healing, and justice. My vision for the Church is that we would center the spiritual vitality and formation of the next generation, especially children ages 0-12. As a mother of four young children under 7, I feel inspired to pour my energy into how the church can better support parents and caregivers of children in leading spirituality in their household context. Church is not somewhere we go, but something we participate in as we open ourselves to the Spirit of Christ in each moment. My conviction is that when we collectively support our children in feeling seen, valued, and respected it will create a world with connection, beauty, healing, and joy.

After graduation, my family will be moving to Ontario, CA to live closer to our extended family and to establish roots and build greater connection among the DOC in the PSWR. I was also invited to submit a grant application to the Lilly Endowment, which focuses on empowering Christian parents and caregivers towards radically inclusive contemplative practices in the home. I hope to hear back from them during the summer of 2023. My anticipated ordination will be in the fall of 2023 at my sponsoring congregation, the First Christian Church of Pomona. I am so grateful for all their support these last few years as a seminarian!

Honoring a Lifetime of Service
